Myriad USA is a member of the **Myriad Alliance**, a global network of nine like-minded partners that facilitate cross-border giving, each from the country or region where they are based. In 2025, the Alliance welcomed two new members: Temasek Trust Foundation Advisors (Singapore) and Prism the Gift Fund (United Kingdom).

DISASTERLINK

Our DisasterLink network of local response organizations enables donors to give quickly and confidently when disaster strikes. In 2025, donors provided \$3.5 million in lifesaving assistance, including to communities devastated by earthquakes in Myanmar and the Philippines, hurricane Melissa in the Caribbean, and deadly floods and landslides across Southeast Asia.

The Right to Dream Academy uses soccer to expand opportunities for vulnerable communities in Egypt.

ADVISORY PLUS

The **Coach Foundation** partnered with Myriad USA, leveraging our Advisory Plus service to conduct a comprehensive landscape analysis of pathways to post-secondary education and employment for young people in South Korea and Malaysia. Our research and grantee recommendations enabled Coach to invest in strategically-aligned and impactful local charities in these countries.



Helping Donors Support Their Favorite Causes Across the Globe

DONOR ADVISED FUNDS

Our Donor Advised Funds enable donors to support trusted nonprofits in any corner of the world. In 2025, Myriad USA facilitated \$3.7 million in grants for the **PepsiCo Foundation**, including \$1 million going to the Right to Dream Academy in Egypt, which is dedicated to expanding opportunities for underserved communities through soccer.

ADVISED GIFTS

Advised Gifts offer a simple option for donors who want to make occasional contributions to international causes. Myriad USA facilitated a \$100,000 gift for **Luminocean**, an Indonesian marine conservation organization which trains local conservationists, restores coral reefs, and protects one of the planet's most vital ecosystems.

Luminocean received \$100,000 to train local conservationists and restore coral reefs in Indonesia.

LEGACY FUNDS

Named after the esteemed Kenyan human rights lawyer, the **Pheroze Nowrojee Legacy Fund** will support scholarships for law students dedicated to the pursuit of justice, studying at law schools in East Africa. Legacy Funds provide continued support to a donor's preferred charity or cause, in perpetuity or for a specific number of years.

MYRIAD ART

Through Myriad ART, we help donors navigate the cultural, legal and tax complexities involved in donating art to museums and cultural institutions overseas. In 2025, Myriad USA received a collection of 362 drawings by American artist Eddie Martinez, now entrusted to the **Albertina Museum** in Vienna, Austria.

AMERICAN FRIENDS FUNDS

Argentina's **Instituto Tecnológico de Buenos Aires (ITBA)** has been a leader in academic excellence and innovation for more than 65 years. Through its Friends of ITBA at Myriad USA, the university launched alumni giving circles and raised over \$265,000 in 2025. Myriad USA hosts American Friends Funds for over 1,600 nonprofits from around the globe, providing them with a cost-effective solution to receive donations from donors in the United States.

Instituto Tecnológico de Buenos Aires (Argentina) raised over \$265,000 through its Friends of ITBA.
